



Practice Incentives Program entry requirements and individual incentive key eligibility requirements

Below is a summary of the entry requirements of the Practice Incentives Program (PIP) and the key eligibility requirements for each PIP incentive.

Practice Incentives Program entry requirements

The PIP encourages continuing improvements in general practice through financial incentives to support quality care and improve access and health outcomes for patients. To be eligible to participate in the PIP, a practice needs to:

- meet the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP) definition of a general practice
- be accredited, or registered for accreditation, against the RACGP *Standards for general practices* and be fully accredited within 12 months of joining the PIP
- maintain practice accreditation
- have current public liability insurance
- make sure that all practice general practitioners (GPs) have current professional indemnity cover.

Eligibility requirements for individual incentives

Quality stream

Diabetes Incentive

The PIP Diabetes Incentive encourages GPs to provide earlier diagnosis and effective management of people with established diabetes mellitus.

Eligibility sign-on requirements

The practice must use a patient register and a recall and reminder system for patients with diabetes mellitus and use the diabetes cycle of care to manage patients with diabetes mellitus.

Cervical Screening Incentive

The PIP Cervical Screening Incentive encourages GPs to screen under-screened women (that is, women who have not had a cervical smear in the last four years) and to increase overall screening rates.

Eligibility sign-on requirements

The practice must agree to have its details provided to the State/Territory cervical screening registers.

Practice Incentives Program entry requirements and individual incentive key eligibility requirements

Asthma Incentive

The PIP Asthma Incentive encourages GPs to better manage the clinical care of people with moderate to severe asthma.

Eligibility sign-on requirements

The practice must agree to have their details forwarded to the appropriate bodies, for example the National Asthma Council Australia and use the asthma cycle of care to manage their patients with moderate to severe asthma.

Capacity stream

eHealth Incentive

The PIP eHealth Incentive encourages practices to keep up-to-date with the latest developments in eHealth.

Eligibility requirements

The practice must have a secure messaging capability, which is provided by an eligible supplier listed on the National E-Health Transition Authority (NEHTA) website. The practice must have (or have applied for) a location/site Public Key Infrastructure (PKI) certificate for the practice and each practice branch. Each practice GP must have (or have applied for) an individual PKI certificate (excluding locums).

The practice must provide all GPs at the practice with access to the current editions of a range of key electronic clinical resources as detailed in the PIP *eHealth Incentive Guidelines*.

Practice Nurse Incentive

The PIP Practice Nurse Incentive encourages general practices to employ practice nurses and/or Aboriginal health workers. Practices in urban areas of workforce shortage are also supported through the PIP to employ allied health professionals such as physiotherapists, dieticians and occupational therapists instead of, or in addition to, practice nurses and/or Aboriginal health workers.

Eligibility requirements

Practices located in Rural, Remote and Metropolitan Areas (RRMA) 1 or 2:

- the practice is located in an urban area of workforce shortage and employs a practice nurse, and/or Aboriginal health worker and/or allied health professional for the required number of sessions per week.

Practices located in RRMA 3-7:

- the practice is located in a rural or remote area and employs a practice nurse and/or Aboriginal health worker for the required number of sessions per week.

After Hours Incentive

The PIP After Hours Incentive encourages general practices to provide patients with access to quality after hours care. For the purposes of the PIP, after hours refers to any time outside 8.00 am to 6.00 pm on weekdays and 8.00 am to 12.00 noon on Saturday. After Hours also includes all day on Sundays and all day on public holidays.

Eligibility requirements

- Tier 1** The practice must make sure that regular practice patients have access to 24 hour care, seven days a week from a doctor. This includes access to after hours visits to patients at home, in residential aged care facilities and in hospitals, where safe and reasonable.
- Tier 2** Practice GPs provide at least 10 hours per week (on average) of the practice's after hours care, where the practice's Standardised Whole Patient Equivalent (SWPE) value is 2000 or less.

OR

Practice GPs provide at least 15 hours per week (on average) of the practice's after hours care where the practice's SWPE value is more than 2000.

- Tier 3** Practice GPs provide 24 hour care, seven days a week, for practice patients.

Practice Incentives Program entry requirements and individual incentive key eligibility requirements

Rural support stream

Procedural GP Payment

The PIP Procedural GP Payment encourages GPs in rural and remote areas to maintain local access to surgical, anaesthetic and obstetric services.

Eligibility requirements

To be eligible for this incentive, the practice must be located in RRMA 3-7 and meet the requirements set out in the *PIP Procedural GP Payment Guidelines*. The payment levels for this incentive relate to the tier classification of the individual GPs.

- Tier 1** A practice GP provides at least one procedural service in the six month reference period.
- Tier 2** A practice GP meets the Tier 1 requirement and provides after hours services on a regular or rostered basis throughout the six month reference period.
- Tier 3** A practice GP meets the Tier 2 requirements and provides 25 or more eligible surgical and/or anaesthetic and/or obstetric services in the six month reference period.
- Tier 4** A practice GP meets the Tier 2 requirements and delivers 10 or more babies in the six month reference period.

Domestic Violence Incentive

The PIP Domestic Violence Incentive encourages general practices in rural and remote areas to act as a referral point for women experiencing domestic violence.

Eligibility requirements

The practice must employ an appropriately trained and qualified practice nurse and/or Aboriginal health worker for the minimum number of sessions per week to act as a referral point for domestic violence support services for women experiencing domestic violence.

Additional PIP incentives

Practices registered for the PIP do not need to apply for the following incentives. Medicare Australia will automatically calculate payments to eligible practices and providers.

Quality stream

Quality Prescribing Incentive (QPI)

The PIP QPI encourages practices to keep up-to-date with information on the quality use of medicines, by rewarding participation in a range of educational activities recognised or provided by the National Prescribing Service (NPS). Medicare Australia calculates payments for this incentive using information supplied by the NPS on the number of activities undertaken by GPs.

Capacity stream

Teaching Incentive

The PIP Teaching Incentive encourages general practices to provide teaching sessions to university medical students, to make sure the practitioners of tomorrow are appropriately trained and have actual experience in general practice. Once a teaching session has been provided, the university will generate a claim form and forward it to the practice for confirmation. The practice must check the claim form for accuracy and forward it to Medicare Australia for processing.

Practice Incentives Program entry requirements and individual incentive key eligibility requirements

GP Aged Care Access Incentive (ACAI)

The PIP GP ACAI encourages GPs to provide increased and continuing services in Commonwealth-funded Residential Aged Care Facilities (RACFs). GPs must use the provider number linked to a PIP practice when claiming Medicare Benefits Schedule (MBS) services in RACFs. Medicare Australia will collect bank account details from GPs who are eligible for payments through this incentive.

Rural support stream

Rural Loading

The PIP Rural Loading recognises the difficulties of providing care, often with little professional support, in rural and remote areas. If your main practice is located in RRMA 3-7, Medicare Australia will automatically calculate the loading and add it to your practice payment.
